GUY LANGEVIN (QC)

Guy is an executive advisor with more than 30 years experience in executive positions (CIO, COO and CEO) in private as well as public organizations.

Professionally, he has a track record of managing risks, creating and implementing innovative strategies, as well as extensive international experience in governance of Information Technology, Cyber Security, project management, fiscal management, operations, manufacturing, supply chain, logistics, international trade compliance, information systems, and telecommunications and Enterprise Risk Management.

Rheanna completed her PhD in Educational Studies at the University of British Columbia in BC'S lower mainland, but has a deep commitment and love for Northern BC and all it has to offer.

Diagnosed with MS in 1997 at the age of 19, Rheanna was determined to still pursue her goals and dreams despite the adversity she was facing. Her post-secondary experiences bolstered her ambitions to contribute to research and knowledge translation and her desires to be part of



important collective conversations about priorities for Indigenous people and their communities.

Prior to taking a leave from her active and engaging career as a professor at the University of Northern British Columbia due to significant MS progression, Rheanna did not ever disclose she lives with MS. However, now, as an Ambassador for the MS Society, disclosure has afforded her important opportunities to highlight the impact of MS on Indigenous people and their communities and systemic barriers in the health care system.

Always committed to principles of equity, diversity, and inclusion, Rheanna looks forward to engaging further with the MS Society of Canada and broadening the perspectives and voices for all Canadians impacted by Multiple Sclerosis.

SHASHI MALIK (AB)

Shashi Malik, MAcc, CPA, CA, J.D., TEP, is a senior partner practicing tax law. He helps clients with mergers, acquisitions, and corporate reorganizations. He is the former Managing Partner for the Calgary office and was a member of the firm's Executive Committee from January 2014 to January 2019.
